Lehi Leaves Jerusalem

**UNIT 6 - Evidence of Authority and Establishing the Church** 

**GRADES 1-3** 

#### THE HOLY BIBLE

Genesis 6.22, "Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he."

#### THE BOOK OF MORMON

1 Nephi 2.2, "And it came to pass that the Lord commanded my father, even in a dream, that he should take his family and depart into the wilderness."

#### **OBJECTIVES**

Participants will be able to:

• Relate through Lehi's story how he/she can show love to God, 1 Nephi chapters 1 & 2.

#### **ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS**

- Why is it good to listen to God?
- How does listening to God tell Him that we love Him?

## **MATERIALS**

Holy Bible and The Book of Mormon

5-sheets of paper of different colors, 5 pencils, and tape/tacks

**Task 1:** Several M&Ms. One small cup/container for each child.

Task 2: One small rock for each child. Red & orange crayons.

**Task 3:** Building blocks (such as a set of *Lego's* or wooden blocks)

45-minute lesson

# Motivation/Introduction (5-7 minutes)

- 1. Introduce students to Lehi, a prophet of God.
  - a. Hold up the Book of Mormon and show the class 1 Nephi chapters 1 & 2 and state that today's story comes from these two chapters.
  - b. Hand out the five sheets of paper randomly to students and a pencil.
  - c. Teacher reads aloud the **Story Map:**Lehi, Prophet of God. When
    reading a word with all capital letters,
    pause at the end of that sentence,
    and select a student to write the
    capitalized word on the sheet of
    paper (One word per sheet of
    paper).
  - d. Tell students to hold up the word cards for all to see. Tell them they will continue learning about Lehi using these special words.
  - e. Collect the papers.

# Story Map: Lehi, Prophet of God

Lehi is a PROPHET who lives in Jerusalem 600 years before Jesus is born. He is sad because the people in Jerusalem are WICKED. One day he prays for the people because he is concerned about the city being destroyed.

While praying, God shows Lehi a pillar of fire upon a ROCK. God speaks to Lehi and tells him that Jerusalem will be DESTROYED unless they repent.

Lehi tells the people in Jerusalem to love God and keep His commandments. The people become angry. Lehi's life is in danger. God tells Lehi to take his family and leave Jerusalem. They travel through the WILDERNESS to the Red Sea.

**Goal:** Relate through Lehi's story how he/she can show love to God.

#### Lesson Development (35-40 minutes)

 Teacher shares a retelling of Lehi living in Jerusalem, using the word cards students made in Motivation/Introduction. The teacher reads the underscored statements aloud in **Story Map: Lehi Lives in Jerusalem**, and follows prompts (See Teacher's Supplement).

- 2. Tell students to pair off and look at the word cards taped to the wall.
  - Tell each pair to take a few minutes to retell each other the story of Lehi leaving Jerusalem using word cards as cues.
  - Invite the paired students to identify their favorite part of the story to share with the class.
- 3. Students imagine what it was like to be Lehi living in Jerusalem.
  - a. Tell students to hold their rocks in their hands and close their eyes and pretend to be Lehi in Jerusalem.
  - b. Tell them to imagine how Lehi felt when God told him that the people in Jerusalem were being wicked, and that he should follow God's commandments.

    Explain: Lehi was obedient to God. It might have been hard to do what was right when everyone else was doing wrong. It may have been hard to leave his family and friends, but he did as God said.
  - c. Tell students to think of a time when they did something right even though everyone else was doing something wrong. Tell them to raise their hands when they have thought of an example.
  - d. When all hands are raised, instruct children to open their eyes. Ask students to share their examples with the class.
- 4. Discuss Essential Questions (Page 1).

## **TEACHER'S SUPPLEMENT**

Story Map: <u>Lehi Lives in Jerusalem</u>

# Lehi is a PROPHET who lives in Jerusalem.

**Prompt:** Hold up the paper that says PROPHET. Explain: A prophet is a man to whom God reveals things known only to God. Lehi was a prophet because God told him things that He was planning to do.

The teacher draws a stick-figure man (Lehi) next to the word PROPHET, and tapes the paper to the wall for all to see.

# <u>Lehi is sad because the people in Jerusalem are</u> WICKED.

**Prompt:** Hold up the paper that says WICKED, and ask the students to define wicked. (Evil, sinful, wrong)

Task 1: Wicked/Righteous Game

- a. Give each child a small cup/container.
- b. State examples of wicked and righteous behaviors (Sharing, Stealing, Telling the truth, Lying, Helping, Hitting, etc.).
- When a child correctly identifies the behavior as wicked or righteous, put an M & M in his or her cup.

The teacher tapes the paper that says WICKED to the wall at the right of the paper that says PROPHET.

One day Lehi prays for the people in Jerusalem because he is concerned about the city being destroyed because of wickedness. While praying, Lehi sees a pillar of fire upon a ROCK and God speaks to him.

**Prompt:** Hold up the paper that says ROCK and ask, "How would you feel if you saw a pillar of fire upon a rock?

Task 2: Give each child one small rock. Provide orange and red crayons. Tell students to draw flames of fire on their rocks.

While students color their rocks, the teacher draws a pillar of fire on a rock on the paper that says ROCK and tapes it to the wall at the right of WICKED.

God tells Lehi that Jerusalem will be DESTROYED and the people will be taken captive into Babylon unless they stop disobeying and repent of their sins.

**Prompt:** Give students wooden blocks and tell them to build the city of Jerusalem. Then, tell students to destroy the city of Jerusalem and put the blocks back in the container.

Hold up the paper with the word DESTROYED, and tape it to the wall at the right of ROCK .

Explain the importance of listening to God. (Listening /obeying God shows God love and respect. It makes God happy. God doesn't like to destroy people or cities. When people disobey and refuse to repent, God is sad and angry, and threatens to punish by destruction.)

Lehi tells the people in Jerusalem to love God and keep His commandments, so God will be happy and spare lives. The people don't listen to Lehi. They make fun of him and become angry. Lehi's life is in danger. God tells Lehi to take his family and leave Jerusalem. They travel through a WILDERNESS to the Red Sea.

**Prompt:** Hold up the paper that says WILDERNESS. Explain: A wilderness is undeveloped land like a desert or forest.

**Q:** Have you ever camped in a wilderness? What was it like?

The teacher draws a few trees on the paper that says WILDERNESS, and tapes it to the wall to the right of DESTROYED.
